Windows of Opportunity

Fenhaus brings architectural precision to Pittsburgh's most ambitious custom homes through expert fenestration consulting

For Pittsburgh's most discerning architects and builders, the difference between a good home and a great one often comes down to what most people never notice: how light enters a room, how sightlines connect interior spaces to the landscape, and how a window specification performs over decades. This is the work Fenhaus was built to do.

"We're not just a retail location. We operate as a consulting firm specializing in high-end windows and doors," says Jeremy Davis, founder. "Our approach is hands on and collaborative, building long-term partnerships with architects and builders that ideally begin at conception and carry through to completion."

Davis founded Fenhaus to serve a specific segment of the Pittsburgh market. Architects designing ambitious homes needed a local partner equipped to support complex fenestration specifications. Fenhaus fills that role, delivering highly tailored specifications for projects that demand precision.

"We're not trying to work with every

architect in Pittsburgh," Davis says. "We want to partner with those who walk into a space and choose to dream bigger. Our role is to collaborate and ensure every detail is executed with precision."

A recent collaboration with Hoffman Leahey Architects LLC on a 90-acre homestead illustrates this philosophy. The project balances craftsmanship with restraint, enhancing the architecture without competing for it. Naturally rot-resistant Douglas fir window trim frames a narrow dining room, where five-panel bifold doors on either side of the table open the space seamlessly from one patio to the other.

"Clad wood windows are the right choice," Davis says. "We routinely remove wood windows that have been in service for a century. We often see vinyl units replaced after just 15 years because the lifespan simply is not comparable. Wood is dimensionally stable and built to last. The quality of installation must match the quality of the window. When both are right, wood is the best long-term investment you can make."
